Assurance Continuity Maintenance Report:

Vertiv Company submitted an Impact Analysis Report to CCEVS for approval on February 28, 2017. The IAR is intended to satisfy requirements outlined in Common Criteria Evaluation and Validation Scheme Publication #6 "Assurance Continuity: Guidance for Maintenance and Re-evaluation" Version 3, September 12, 2016. In accordance with those requirements, the IAR describes the changes made to the certified TOE, the evidence that was updated as a result of those changes, and the security impact of those changes.

Changes to TOE:

The products outlined in the original TOE and delineated in Table 3 of the Security Target have been changed, replacing the corporate name Emerson Network Power with the new corporate name Vertiv. There are no changes being made to the hardware, software or firmware. The changes only affect the company name, logos and branding information as described below.

None of the changes were security related, and no changes were made to the development environment.

The changes:

- The products outlined in the original TOE and delineated in the Security Target Table 3 have been changed to reflect replacing references to Emerson Network Power with the new corporate name Vertiv.
- The logo images and accent colors of the units have been changed.
- Name and logo changes have also been made on all relevant product documentation, labeling and packaging.

The vendor has classified all the changes as minor, “It is important to note that no changes have been made to the electronics or firmware on any of the TOE models; the model names and manufacturing numbers remain the same.”

Conclusion: The changes to the TOE are limited to the corporate rebranding from Emerson to Vertiv. The vendor claims that all known publicly-disclosed cybersecurity vulnerabilities applicable to versions of the TOE prior to the changed TOE have been mitigated.

The validators reviewed the changes and concur that they should be classified as minor and that certificate maintenance is the correct path for assurance continuity. Therefore, CCEVS agrees that the original assurance is maintained for the above cited version of the product.
